PERFORMANCSTANDARDSORPROGRESSION

- 1. The student must complete all required core courses with a grade of ³ & or better and possess a minimum GPA of 3.00 prior to starting the BSN program.
- 2. The student must maintain an examina/tiesst average at or above a 75% for all clinical nursing courses. Additional course assignments, such as writing assignments, course projects, or standardizedestingresults will not be calculated not the VWX Ginha Og Na/Offeit/a 75% average has not been obtained An examination/tessaverage below 75% will result in a failing course grade. Components of the 75% examination/tessaverage will be identified in each nursing course syllabus.
- 3. The student must maintain an overall grade point average of 2.0(C) throughout heir Nursing Program.
- 4. The student must adhete all UNG, Department of Nursing, and clinical agencipolicies.
- 5. The student must maintain satisfactory performance in the clinical area. An unsatisfactory evaluation in the clinical etting means an automatic grade of 0.0 (F) in the course.
- 6. If a studenpasses the clinical component course and isot successful in thelassroom component, both clinical and classroom components must be repeated.
- 7. Studentswill be givenonly one opportunity to repeat a nursing ourse successfully.
- 8. A student whowithdraws fromor is not successful in nursing course will only be allowed to return on a space available basis. Priority for nursing class registration will be given to students who follow the plan of study that they signed upon entering the program.
- 9. Failure or withdrawal from two nursing program courses will result in dismissal from the nursing program. Students who are dismissed from the nursing program are not eligible to reapply.
- ³/₄ An exemption to the BSN nursing withdrawal policy will be considered for one semester if the student was granted a hardship withdrawal by the Dean of Students.

GRADESCALE

Due to the nature of nursing responsibilities and the preparation necessary for practing, the grade scale is slightly igher for nursing courses than that equired for other courses at the University of North Georgia

An earnedgradeof at least 75.0 must be attained by the studen to receive a passing grade in all nursing courses.
